





One of my goals in retirement is to build a well detailed model railroad layout so I appreciated David's talk.



Message from the Educational Officer

As a reminder, I mentioned the following facts in my last article from the “US Coast Guard 2015 Recreational Boating Statistics” (<http://www.uscgboating.org/library/accident-statistics/Recreational-Boating-Statistics-2015.pdf>) report. You can find these statistics and more in the report’s executive summary:

- Where cause of death was known, 76% of fatal boating accident victims drowned. Of those drowning victims with reported life jacket usage, 85% were not wearing a life jacket.
- Where instruction was known, 71% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction. Only 15% percent of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had received a nationally-approved boating safety education certificate.

Important! New Scheduled Classes

Keeping these facts in mind the NVSPS will be presenting a **Piloting (P)** course starting Saturday November 19th. This class is primarily for Sea Scout Ship 1942, but is open to NVSPS members and the general public.

The Piloting course will be held in five - four hour sessions from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM on Saturday mornings at St. George’s Episcopal Church, 915 North Oakland St, Arlington, VA 22203

The tuition for the Piloting course is \$80 for USPS Members and \$105 for Non-Members; the tuition includes the “Weekend Navigator” book. There is a take home final exam for the Piloting course.

An **Advanced Piloting (AP)** class is tentatively planned for February 2017 also at St. George’s

As members, Advanced Courses are a good review of your seamanship skills. Consider taking one of these updated courses if you took your advanced courses several years ago. Please let me know as soon as possible if you are planning on attending the Piloting course.

District 5 Fall Education Conference

The D/5 Fall Education Conference is being held in Cambridge, MD at the Hyatt Regency, Chesapeake Bay Resort on November 17th through the 20th. As always, there is a wealth of information available on USPS educational topics. On Friday, a CPR/First Aid class will be held from 0800-1700. Also on Friday, an instructor recertification class and a seminar on Open CPN (the latest USPS Navigation tool) will be held along with many other topics of interest. Potomac River Tributary Highlight

The **Occoquan River** is a tributary of the Potomac River in Northern Virginia, where it serves as part of the boundary between Fairfax and Prince William counties in Virginia. The river is 24.7 miles long and its watershed covers about 590 square miles. It is formed by the confluence of Broad Run and Cedar Run in Prince William County. It has 3 dams along its length collecting water for Fairfax and Prince William counties and City of Manassas.

The three parks bordering the Occoquan River are Bull Run, Occoquan, and Fountainhead.
