DON'T MAKE THIS MISTAKE

A court has ruled that a boat advertised on an internet auction site must be handed over for just €22.50 (\$30 US) after the seller forgot to set a minimum price for it. Jakob Kauder had expected to sell his 21ft boat for at least €12,000 (\$16,000 US) when he placed it on a German auction site. When he realized his mistake he tried to retract the boat from auction on the site, citing "technical problems" and "errors" on the website. Judges in Köln ruled that the sale was legally binding, however, because no reserve price had been placed on the boat. A court spokesman said, "The seller must make good on his offer. Pages 163 thru 194 (32 pages) are not the pages for Vol. 1 covering SW MA coast and all RI coast and bays, but are in fact the pages from Vol. 3 and cover the SW coast of Fl (Sanibel thru Tampa Bay).


