

During his year as Cdr., two of our members, Dr. Lloyd Hazleton and Mrs.Grace Murphy, offered to donate \$5,000 in memory of their deceased spouses for the Squadron to use for educational equipment. Chuck suggested the establishment of The Flower Power Fund, a perpetual trust fund where only the interest would be spent and the fund would grow. Today the fund's value has grown more than three times. Chuck also served as District 5 Chairman of Advanced Piloting. He and his wife Annie Eby aboard their boats, Sixebys and Chuggin Annie were familiar participants at Squadron navigational contests and rendezvous.

AUTOMATIC IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM AIS

Last October AIS Class B was approved for use in the US. To learn about AIS and what it can do for you, plus the equipment, read here:

AIS is a signal sent out by commercial shipping and can be picked up with an AIS receiver connected to your VHF antenna. The AIS signal tells you the sending vessels SOG, COG, Position and destination. AIS is very useful information for the boater, for navigating in shipping channels, and open Oceans. RSS feeds are available at http://www.Myboatsgear.com

On 1 July 2009 the Virginia Personal Water Craft (PWC) Law requirement for operators 20 years and younger to have taken and passed a squadron boating course. This requirement will encourage many younger PWC operators to take qualifying courses – NVSPS will be there to help. Squadron members give free VSC's to all boaters, checking for required life jackets and other safety equipment, up-to-date emergency flares, working navigation lights, etc. along with advice on safe operation of boats.

The Squadron will also sponsor "Wounded Warriors Cruise" 2009. This very worthwhile cruise touches many and is at the heart of contributing to soldiers who have given so much.
