Wounded Warrior 2009 - I am very pleased to report that Captain Macyko U.S.N, Commanding Officer, Naval Air Station (NAS) Patuxent River, MD, approved the squadron's request to host the NVSPS 2009 Wounded Warrior Cruise from the base at the West Basin Marina on Saturday 10 October. George Nartsissov (XO) and I visited NAS Pax River yesterday, Friday 18 September, to meet base representatives and refine our joint plan for EXCOM approval next week. The NAS staff has been responsive and enthusiastic providing terrific support. George and I also walked the piers and find them adequate for our use. The Dock Master, Frank Pace, helped coordinate visits with base catering facilities and introductions to senior staff that will assist. The XO drafted an operations plan to help coordinate the five participating boats and skippers. Pax River Sail & Power Squadron (PRS&PS) Executive Officer, L/Cdr Randy Headrick, will join us with his 55' Blue Water Boat, "R Dream", capable of carrying 20+ warriors. PRS&PS will also support handling dock lines and shore activities including the picnic/dinner costs. Pax West Basin Marina is waiving any overnight slip fees for participating boats.

We are asking members to support our warriors on the water, on the shore and from home. George Nartsissov' article provides details for participating and joining this great squadron event.

<u>Education</u> - I urge all members to take one of the seven advanced courses scheduled this fall and winter by NVSPS. Last month, USPS announced that members taking advanced courses will be eligible to win handheld VHF radios and GPS', navigational software sets, barometers, multi-meters and chart plotters. Everyone who takes and passes an advanced course between July 2009 and June 2010 will automatically be entered to win a prize! Enhance your boating skills this winter through NVSPS quality courses.

<u>Participation</u> - Members are encouraged to attend the D5 Fall Conference in Rockville, MD 5-8 Nov. 2009 to learn about Boat Operator Certification, Best Squadron Practices, and updates from National Governor's Meeting in September. This is particularly important for future bridge officers and Excom members. Attend all or selected areas of interest and you will be surprised at how much you can learn. The conference is free. USPS now has classroom seminars to prepare boaters for their On the Water (OTW) experience. USPS is now an on the water training organization. I encourage experienced members to achieve this new BOC qualification to extend our squadron training on to the water. Contact me if you are interested. You must have a boat to achieve the certification.




Our Squadron is planning a cruise for the Wounded Warriors from Walter Reed Army Medical center (WRAMC) on October 10, 2009. We have received approval from Walter Reed for the event and we are proceeding with planning the event.

CDR Francis Williamson contacted the base commander at Patuxent Naval Air Station, MD, just across the Patuxent River from Solomons, MD., and the base commander has approved the event and is giving us full support. The plan is to stage the cruise from the West Basin Marina at the Naval Air Station. So far we have three boats from our Squadron (CDR Williamson, P/CDR Segerson and Lt/C Nartsissov) and a boat from the Patuxent River Squadron. We need another boat or two from our Squadron. We indicated to WRAMC that we can accommodate 20 persons, however, if we have more boats we can possibly increase that number.



Here is yet another great reason to continue your boating education and earn higher grades. If you successfully complete an advanced or elective course between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2009, you will automatically be entered into a United States Power Squadrons drawing to win valuable prizes. How valuable you might ask? Those members currently taking the Piloting course will have an opportunity to win a handheld GPS unit! Anyone successfully completing Advanced Piloting in the spring could win a set of navigational software. What about the Weather course in the winter? Yes, you could win a barometer. The Weather course will teach you how to put a barometer to good use. We may even offer an Engine Maintenance class for the Sea Scouts and other members (if space is available). That course is currently being planned. Successful completion of Engine Maintenance would qualify you for a drawing to win a multimeter. The winner's will be selected at the 2010 Governing Board meeting held in Seattle from August 30th through September 4th, 2010. Check our website at www.nvsps.org for the latest course schedule. Directions To Fairfax Yacht Club From the Beltway:

Travel south on I95 from the Beltway and take the exit for Woodbridge via US Rt. 1 south. Turn left at Furnace Road, which is at the first traffic light. This is just prior to the Occoquan River Bridge. Follow Furnace Road through the railroad underpass (Caution-one car wide and a blind turn, sound your horn before entering). Continue about another 75-100 yards where Furnace Road bears to the left and joins Old Colchester Road. Do not bear to the left but proceed straight across. This is a private lane, which leads into the Fairfax Yacht Club. Follow this lane through the gate (it will be open) and park at any open space.

2009-2010 Squadron Improvement Initiative

In this issue of the Squadron's Newsletter, we take the opportunity to update the General Membership concerning the Commander's 2009-2010 Squadron Improvement Initiative. While this initiative initially was focused on automating and updating Squadron activities, we found that there are many other ideas concerning improvements we might make. A critical objective of this initiative is to enable more members to be more active in Squadron activities—we need to hear from you—please contact any Improvement Area Lead with your thoughts, ideas, or a concern or suggestion for improvement (see contact information provided below).

The most recent version of our "Vision and Scope (V&S) Document" concerning this initiative is available from Squadron Secretary Ralph Young—to get a copy, send an email to ryoungrr@aol.com. This Document describes the purpose of the Initiative; summarizes current NVSPS capacities and capabilities; identifies Squadron "stakeholders" (those the Squadron is attempting to service); prioritizes 2009-2010 NVSPS objectives and activities; identifies Squadron success factors and measures; and describes a set of "Improvement Areas" and ideas.

A theme of this Initiative is to reinforce an attitude and habit of "continuous improvement" throughout the Squadron. We consider the V&S Document a "living document" that is updated as we learn of additional contributions and members who want to become involved.
