



Well, it's almost time to get back out on the water again. And this year before you go, I'd like to let you know about a relatively new program being offered by USPS. The program is called the Boat Operator Certification program. It consists of four separate courses of study designed to build boating skills. The courses are sequential, each one building on the one previous, and it is for USPS members only. The best part of this program is that includes a practical demonstration of skills on the water which is a significant step beyond the academic instruction now provided.

USPS will certify USPS members at various levels of recreational boating proficiency. It is planned that these certifications will be recognized across the boating community, both domestically and internationally. The Boat Operator Certification program aligns with plans outlined by the United States Coast Guard (USCG) to establish requirements for standards of proficiency for recreational boaters. USCG has asked Congress for approval to implement this plan through the Secretary of Transportation. USPS intends for the Boat Operator Certification to be demonstrated proof of this recreational boater proficiency and be accepted as the national certificate for the United States as well as meeting the requirements of UN Resolution 40, <u>International Certificate for the Operation of Pleasure Craft</u> with the additional knowledge and testing of the CEVNI (European code for inland waterways) navigation rules.

This is where you come in. USPS currently plans four levels of Boat Operator Certification: Inland Navigator, Coastal Navigator, Advanced Coastal Navigator and Offshore Navigator. The first two of the four courses of study are ready for enrollment.

Some of the member advantages for successful completion of the Boat Operator Certification include: ability to rent, charter or lease a boat, even in foreign countries, obtain insurance, engage in competition boating, serve on an various advisory panels, build skill and confidence in your own abilities and learn to teach others on the water.

Requirements to receive the Inland Navigator Boat Operator Certification include completion of specific USPS courses and USPS and/or non-USPS seminars when validated by instructor plus completion of an "on the water" skill demonstration validated by trained certifier. All requirements must be

fulfilled before the certification is awarded. Additionally, to be certified, a member must be at least 16 years of age, be mentally and physically capable of operating a boat, and have sufficient visual and auditory sensory ability to do so. Thankfully, holding a driver's license will suffice to certify meeting the above requirements . Prior completion of USPS courses required for the certification will be credited towards fulfillment of the certification requirements. This means you may be almost half way there!!

So, lets get going! We can order your Passport and kits for Inland Navigator and Coastal Navigator today and lay out a course of training to get certified. Some of our members have already started. Safety for All!

If you want to find a real bargain for your home, you look into area yard sales, right? What if you are looking for a great bargain on something for your boat? Well, Herrington Harbour North had the answer on May 7 with the "Boaters Yard Sale." Not only could you find great treasures from others' storage lockers, but you could also get your free vessel safety examination while you were at it.

The Northern Virginia Sail and Power Squadron (NVSPS) had a number of its member Vessel Examiners on hand to accommodate boaters who wanted to take advantage of this important service provided by the Squadron. George Nartsissov, chair of the Vessel Safety Check program for NVSPS said, "If we have to be off the water on a gorgeous day like today, I cannot think of a better use of our time than to help our fellow boaters by checking the safety of their boats."

To pass inspection vessel owners must produce all required registration or documentation forms and demonstrate properly working safety equipment such as horns, lights, waste management and life jackets, among other items. They must also have on hand current signal flaress and fire extinguishers. Most boaters have flares on hand, however, many times they have expired and need to be replaced. Vessels that pass the inspection are issued a Safe Vessel decal for display on their hull.


