

March 14 Guest Speaker Boating Writer Mark Corke —Building Mallard

Mark Corke will speak about the building of *Mallard*, a gaffrigged cutter, his fifth build. 26' overall, constructed from cedar strips and epoxy resin, it took five years of part-time work to complete. He built the boat entirely on his own with no outside help apart from turning the hull over before fitting out the inside. The boat has been cruised extensively, especially along the Maine coast and up to Canada.

Mark Corke began sailing with his father, at the age of 2



and has been on some sort of boat every year since. He built his first boat, a 12-foot dinghy, when he was in high school in England. After university worked for the London Financial Times, then the BBC, and subsequently a bunch of yachting magazines. He is a holder Royal Yachting Association Yachtmaster / Maritime and Coastguard Agency ticket with sail endorsement and has written 4 DIY books. He has sailed around the world a few times on racing yachts both as skipper and as navigator. A SAMS accredited marine surveyor, he is Associate Editor at *BoatU.S. Magazine*, specializing in DIY and technical subjects. When not working he is often found either in his workshop building another boat, or out on the Chesapeake cruising on his Grand Banks 32 trawler. Presentation at 7:30 pm. Meeting info on page 2.
