





Message from the Commander



Dear Fellow Members,

I'm looking forward to the squadron's scheduled yearly election in March of 2020. All of the elected squadron officers serve for only a one year term per election, so all elected squadron officer positions are up for next election. Also the current Commander is at the end of his two year term limit, so he will not stand for re-election. If a member wishes to be a candidate for a particular elective office, a discussion should be started with Alan Hart Chair of the Nominating Committee. If a member wishes to be appointed to an appointed position described below, a discussion should be started with any bridge officer.

ELECTED SQUADRON OFFICERS

BRIDGE OFFICERS

COMMANDER: The commander is the presiding officer of all squadron membership and Executive Committee (EXCOM) meetings. At the squadron level, the commander is expected to respond to all District 5 and national USPS communications, and perform all leadership tasks.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER: The Executive Officer presides at all squadron general membership and EXCOM meetings and other duties in the absence of the Commander. The Executive Officer provides the leadership for all external activities for the squadron such as squadron newsletter, public relations, and boat show participation.

EDUCATIONAL OFFICER: The Educational Officer is responsible for the entire squadron educational program including the selection of the courses offered by the squadron, scheduling of the courses, and; negotiation of the site, and selection of the instructor(s). This officer may be assisted by an Assistant Educational Officer.

ASSISTANT EDUCATIONAL OFFICER (optional): The Assistant Educational Officer operates under the direction of the Educational Officer and assists the Educational Officer in assigned responsibilities

ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER: The Administrative Officer provides the leadership for all internal squadron activities such as recruitment new members and retention of existing members, arranging for activities, and keeping members involved in activities.

SECRETARY: The Secretary is responsible for recording the minutes of all squadron meetings and maintaining the squadron membership records.

TREASURER: The Treasurer is responsible for managing the squadron financial activities and keeping of appropriate records.

AT LARGE BOARD MEMBERS: There are five (5) at-large board members that represent the squadron membership at the EXCOM.

APPOINTED POSITIONS

The following positions are appointed on the authority of the Commander:

Editor of the squadron newsletter is responsible for the editing and submission of the newsletter to the printer and submitting it for posting to squadron website.

Webmaster is responsible for the "care and feeding" of the squadron's website

Boat Show Chairman is responsible for maintaining liaison with National Capital Boat Show and other local boat shows and organizing the staffing of the squadron's booth if appropriate.

Public Relations Chair is responsible for promoting all squadron activities to the public.

Property Officer: maintains the inventory of all squadron property.

Membership Chair is responsible for the retention of existing members and the recruitment of new members.


