# Nominations Are Open for All NVSPS Positions

# Nominations will be accepted for 2022-2023 Service year for NVSPS, up until Election Day, March 8, 2022 (2nd Tuesday).

Elections will be held at the Tuesday, March 8, 2022 meeting. All officers are elected for a single year at a time. Some have served for several years and would like to be relieved. If you are interested in any elected position, please contact P/C Alan Hart, AP at 540-898-6002 or 1oldtar@gmail.com. Please note that the first character in Alan's email address is the numeral "1."

The elected positions are:

- $\Rightarrow$  Commander
- $\Rightarrow$  Executive Officer
- $\Rightarrow$  Administrative Officer
- $\Rightarrow$  Education Officer
- $\Rightarrow$  Assistant Education Officer
- $\Rightarrow$  Secretary
- ⇒ Treasurer
- $\Rightarrow$  Plus 5 Members-at-Large
- $\Rightarrow$  Plus Members of 3 Standing Committees



- The Squadron Commander is our elected leader. He/she officiates at meetings and supervises the other Bridge Officers. Our By-Laws limit the Commander to two consecutive terms.
- The Executive Officer supervises the committees in his/her department and substitutes for the Commander when necessary.
- The Administrative Officer supervises the committees in his/her department. We have not had an Administrative Officer for the past several years, but the duties have been done by the Secretary and the Commander.
- The Squadron Education Officer (SEO) supervises the squadron's education courses and programs.
- The Assistant Squadron Education Officer works directly with the Squadron Education Officer (SEO) on the squadron's education courses and programs. The Assistant Squadron Education Officer also substitutes for the Squadron Education Officer when necessary.
- The Secretary records minutes of meetings and handles personnel records, including correspondence with District and National.
- The Treasurer keeps the squadron's financial records, writes checks and receives payments.

- The 5 Members-at-Large of the Executive Committee are your elected representatives and each has a vote at meetings. Contact them if you have an issue to be brought before the Executive Committee.
- A member may normally only hold one of the twelve listed offices at any one time, but may be a committee chair in addition to being a Bridge Officer. I (P/C Alan Hart, AP) have held them all, except for Treasurer, Education Officer and Assistant Education Officer, and found them to be very enjoyable and rewarding.

The listed elected officers, along with the most recent Past Commander available and willing to serve, make up the Executive Committee, also known as the Board of Directors. All are elected for one year terms, and may be re-elected, except for the Commander, who is limited to two consecutive terms.

The Rules Committee periodically reviews the By-Laws and recommends changes and updates, to be voted on by the membership. It is composed of six members, two of which are elected for three-year terms, each year. The Chair is selected each year by the members of the committee.

The Auditing Committee audits the squadron's financial records and accounts each year. Its three members are elected for three-year terms, one per year. The Chair is the member with the longest term of service on the committee.

The Nominating Committee nominates candidates for elective office, to be voted on at the squadron's Annual Meeting. Other candidates may be nominated by petition to the squadron Secretary, or from the floor at the Annual Meeting. Its six members are elected, two per year, for three-year terms. The Chair is selected annually by the committee members.

Elections are held annually, at the squadron's Annual Meeting. All members in good standing who are present are entitled to vote. There is no provision for absentee voting or voting by proxy at this time.



# You Help Keep Our Sea Scout Ship Afloat!!





## Donate Your Old Sails To Be Recycled By Sea Bags

I donated our old *Justice* mainsail to Sea Bags (www.SeaBags.com) in Annapolis in December 2021. They accept donations of old sails in good condition and offer a gift in exchange. Our old sail, from the previous owner, had been taking up valuable space in our attic for 12 years. Dave and I got it down the narrow attic stairs, then down the main stairs and unfolded it on the lawn. We took a photo for Sea Bags so they could see the general condition. I think it weighed about 20 pounds.

I emailed the photo and dimensions to Sea Bags to see if it was something they could use. They positively replied and I dropped it off when I was going that way anyway.



Fair well to the old sail, accepted by Sea Bags. This sail was reefed a lot since the previous owners did not have a storm sail for their ocean passages. This resulted in the top part of the sail being stretched out more than the bottom.

They weighed it and referred to a gift value chart to see which free gift I could choose in return. They let me choose among their many \$150 bags! It was hard to choose, as you can see from their website, they had many designs and colors. I made my choice from the Watercolor Collection which Dave is holding in the photo and I bought a smaller matching bag to go with it! No regrets!

More than bags, Sea Bags makes door mats, lounge chairs, pillows and baskets and you can design your own bag online.



Sea Bags has reclaimed over 700 tons of sails since they started in 2020. Through their Sail Trade Program, they can arrange for proceeds from a Sail Drive to go toward a charity. See a video and read stories from their program at www.SeaBags.com – choose Explore Tab and Trade a Sail submenu.
