




Commander's Message

In Memoriam: P/C George K. Degnon, P



Past Commander George K. Degnon, P, passed away on October 9, 2022 at age 82. George joined USPS in 1997 and became Commander of NVSPS in 2008. He described that job as "a very rewarding gig," filled with work and lots of fun for himself and his wife, Marge.

Under George's leadership, NVSPS organized and held its first Wounded Warrior Cruise at Chesapeake Yacht Club for 18 soldiers being treated at Walter Reed Army Medical Center and their family members. They were hosted by squadron members on a dozen sail and power boats for a beautiful day of well-deserved cruising on the West River and Chesapeake Bay. That evening everyone gathered for a delicious dinner at the yacht club. Both soldiers and squadron members were grateful for that memorable day. The following spring NVSPS received the District Commanders Award for Excellence in Community Service in recognition of the Wounded Warrior Cruise and a holiday collection of food and toys for deserving families in Georgia.

Wounded Warrior Cruises became very popular. The third cruise in 2010 had 42 warriors and family members and boats from three local squadrons participating. NVSPS taught other District 5 squadrons how to organize a cruise at the 2010 spring conference.

George and Marge cruised the Chesapeake with NVSPS on their 37' Mariner Yacht "Irish Ayes." During one squadron cruise to Baltimore, George discovered a stowaway on board. A bird had built a nest in the bow anchor locker. George's year as Commander was full of accomplishments and surprises.
